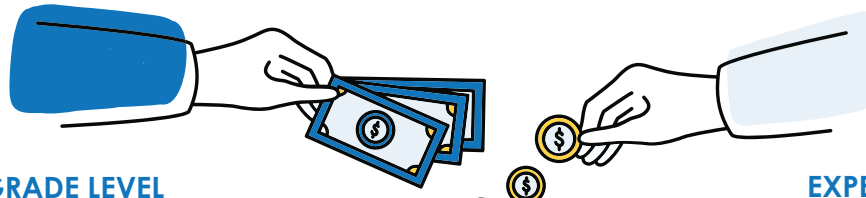


YOU Made it HAPPEN

EXPENDITURES BY GRADE LEVEL

Kindergarten

Kindergartens enjoyed a field trip to Lake Norman State Park, an extended reading workshop at NCCAT in Cullowhee, materials for math and reading workshops, different building centers for STEAM lessons, a Little Passports monthly subscription program, books and more.

First Grade

Each classroom refreshed white boards, erasers, markers and added four Chrombooks per class. One classroom received standing magnetic/white-boards.

Second Grade

Second grade purchased books to support literacy skills to enhance vocabulary acquisition and oral and written comprehension, STEM kits and fully funded one teacher to attend NCCAT and earn a literacy badge for her teaching certificate.

Third Grade

Third grade teachers attended the "Get Your Teach On" conference led by Hope and Wade King. This conference was filled with engagement strategies and teaching resources. We also purchased the yearly subscription to "Set the Stage to Engage" and Lego glasses and black lights.

Fourth Grade

Fourth grade purchased an interactive white board, owl pellets for the kids to dissect, and non-fiction leveled books.

Fifth Grade

5th grade enjoyed a "Day of Science" put on by Discovery Place of Charlotte. They also purchase stethoscopes, a weather station, and Build-a-Body posters, and attended the "Get Your Teach On" conference.

Sixth Grade

The sixth grade students were able to participate in The Hovercraft Project at Sherrills Ford. The Hovercraft Project is problem based learning requiring cooperative groups to use teamwork to create a functioning hovercraft.

EXPENDITURES CONTINUED

Specials

For the Music room, Mr. Whitener purchased new instruments as well as attended the North Carolina Music Educators conference where he participated in workshops, learned new music education techniques, and collaborated with music teachers from across the state.

For the Art room, MIH funds were used to purchase art supplies, flexible seating in the form of a Big Joe chair, plastic stools, and cushions have provided students with the option to sit more comfortably during their art making activities.

CAMPUS IMPROVEMENTS

Campus improvement funds were focused on the improvement and quality of our playground space. We put in a Concrete Pad on K-2 Playground and installed Shade Structures on both K-2 and 3-6 playgrounds.

SURPLUS FUNDS | \$13,830

Surplus funds greatly aided in the completion of the playground upgrades. The additional \$13,830 surplus was put to the Concrete Pad on K-2 Playground .

SPONSOR DONATION | \$5,000

Dermatology Group of the Carolina's generously donated \$5,000 specifically to help us complete the Shade Structures on both playgrounds.

PRIORITY 1: K-2 PLAYGROUND | \$35,000

\$25,000 will be allocated to update the 3-6 Playground. Funding will remove aging equipment, relocate existing structures, and add new slides with a goal to create an exciting, unified play space.
